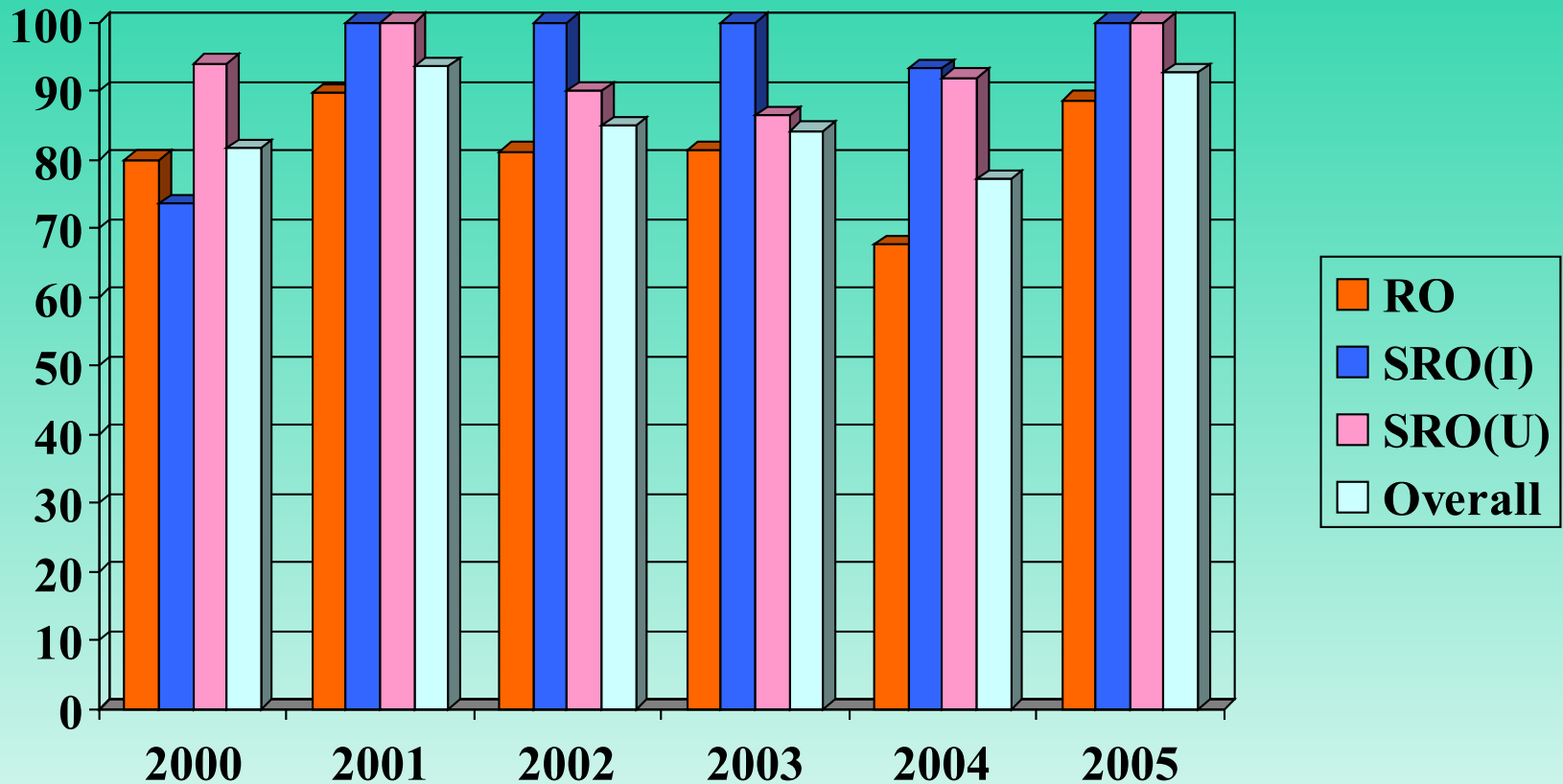

# Application Forms (Continued)

- Another way to submit
  - You may submit your operator licensing application forms electronically.
  - First, since the application requires three signatures, you must first have all three people sign the form, then scan the form in Adobe Acrobat (preferred) format.
  - Next send the form to the E-mail address of your chief examiner (supplied in the last paragraph of the cover letter scheduling the examination
